Write a brief summary of the following passage:

Self-control is at the root of all virtues. Let a man give the rein to his impulses and passions, and from that moment yields up his moral freedom. He is carried along the current of life and becomes the slave of his strongest desires for the time being. To be morally free to be more than an animal, man must be able to resist his instructive. Impulse and this can only be done by the exercise of self -control. This is the power which constitute other real distinction between physical and moral life, and forms the primary basis of the individual character. In the Bible, praise is given not to the strong man who 'taketh a city' but to the stronger man who 'ruleth his own spirit'. The stronger man is he, who by discipline, exercises a constant control over his thoughts, his speech and his acts. Nine-tenth of vicious desires that degrade society, and when indulged swell into the crime that disgraces it would shrink into insignificance before the advance of various self-discipline, self-respect and self- control. By the watchful exercise of these virtues, the purity of heart and mind becomes habitual and the character is built up in chastity, virtue and temperance. 10
