Great books do not spring from something accidental in the great men who wrote them. They are the influence of their very core, the expression of the life itself of the authors. And literature cannot be said to have served its true purpose until it has been translated into the actual life of him who reads. It does not succeed until it becomes the vehicle of the vital. Progress is the gradual result of the emending battle between human reason and human instinct, in which it forms slowly but surely wins. The most powerful engine in this battle is literature. It is the vast reservoir of true ideas and emotions. In a world deprived of literature; the intellectual and emotional activity of all but a few exceptionally gifted men would quickly sink and react to a narrow tend to discover for want of accessible storage. And life would be correspondingly degraded, because the fallacious idea and the pretty emotion would never feel the upward pull of the ideas and emotions of genius. Only by conceiving a society without literature is to raise the plain towards the top level of the peaks. Literature exists so that where one man has lived finely; ten thousand may afterwards live finely. It is a means of life, it concerns the living essence.
